

## QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR HEALTHCARE TEAM: CLINICAL TRIALS

Use this resource as a guide for a discussion with your healthcare team. Be sure to bring a pen and print multiple copies for other members of your caregiver team that may be joining you for the appointment so that they can take notes as well.

What is the goal of this clinical trial?
Does my biomarker status effect my ability to participate in this trial?
What kind of tests or treatment will I be given?
Will I see my test results?
Has this experimental drug been tested in other clinical trials, or is approved for use for other diseases?
Will I know if I have the experimental treatment or if I am getting a standard of care/placebo?
If I am getting the standard of care/placebo, what kind of treatment is that?
How long will I participate in the trial? How often do I need to come in for treatment? Is any portion of the trial in-patient?
What are the risks and side effects I may experience?
How will I know if the experimental drug is working for me?
Can I continue to see my oncologist even though he or she is not involved with this trial? Who will be in charge of my care?
Are there any costs I will be responsible for by participating in the trial? If so, are they covered by insurance?
Is there any compensation or transportation assistance?
What if my medical condition worsens during the trial?
If the treatment works for me, can I continue to get the drug even after the trial is completed?
Can I leave the study if I no longer want to participate?
Who is my main contact if I have questions or concerns during the trial?
Will the clinical trial team continue to follow my progress after the trial ends?
Will the results of the study be shared with me?
If I choose not to participate in a clinical trial, what treatment options are available to me?
